PERFORMER WANTED



It is now the eighth month in the lunar calendar, the time for the Chinese to celebrate the Mid-Autumn festival. It is so called because it is in the middle of the eighth month, which is a full moon. We used to celebrate the full moon by fruit, moon cake, and children played their lanterns with neighbors. Why should people celebrate the moon in mid-Autumn? It's because of a story happened long long time ago in China.

On the 15th day of the 8th month of the lunar calendar (Oct. 2 this year), the moon is full and it is time for the Chinese people to mark their Moon Festival, or the Mid-Autumn Festival. The round shape symbolizes family reunion. Therefore the day is a holiday for family members to get together and enjoy the full moon – an auspicious



token of abundance, harmony and luck.

There is this story about the moon-cake. During the Yuan dynasty (A.D. 1280-1368) China was ruled by the Mongolian people. Leaders from the preceding Sung dynasty (A.D. 960-1280)

were unhappy at submitting to the foreign rule, and set out to coordinate the rebellion without being discovered. The leaders of the rebellion, knowing that the Moon Festival was drawing near, ordered the making of special cakes. Imbedded in each moon caked was a message with the outline of the attack. On the night of the Moon Festival, the rebels successfully attacked and overthrew the government. Today, moon cakes are eaten to commemorate this legend and was called the Moon Cake.

StarTalk

The Chinese Language School of Ventura County is much honored to be selected as one of the "StarTalk Good Will Program" site for the second year in a row. This federal government subsidized language program provides a vigorous but fun *Chinese Language Immersion Program* for students at the high school level to learn Chinese as a foreign/second language and earn foreign language credit at the same time.

We have expanded from one to three classes this summer, and have a total of 48 students for the three classes held successfully at Rio Mesa High School from June 22nd to August 5th. Students learned the basic

principles of listening, speaking, reading, and writing the Chinese language based on the National Standards for Foreign Language Learning and the richness of Chinese Culture through cultural activities such as Lion Dancing, Taichi, Chinese Diabolo (Chinese Yoyo), Calligraphy and Painting, Chinese Crafts, and others.



My special thanks to our Taichi teacher, Ms. Rosy Shaw; Calligraphy teacher, Mr. Herbert Yen; Chinese

Brush Painting teacher, Mr. Richard Lu; and our teachers, Ms. Michelle Liang, Ms. Shuqin Zhao, Ms. Dolly Cheng, and Mr. Leon Lee; our Special Lion Dance teacher and teachers' aid from Taiwan. All of you have helped make this program possible and contributed to its success.

I hope more students, children and grandchildren of our Association will take advantage of this program next year to further explore our cultural heritage and enhance our Chinese linguistics skills.



Scholarships

The following speech was presented at Buena High School Awards Night and submitted by Angela Soo Hoo, PhD, for publication.

“Teachers, parents and graduates:”

“William D. Soo Hoo Memorial Scholarship is in honor of Bill Soo Hoo, who was the first Chinese American mayor in California, and perhaps even the United States. He was born in Oxnard and is its first native to be mayor in 1966. This scholarship is given by the Ventura County Chinese American Association.”

“[The] VCCAA was started in 1970 with a language school. It now has classes that are accredited by our high school education board. Its instructors are mostly from our close-by colleges. The association has expanded to include a Kung Fu Club teaching kung fu as well as lion dance. It is run by Master Kee C. Ling, who is also a [Calif. Superior Court] judge in our U.S. court system. A dance troupe headed by director Yu-Ling Lu, who is a graduate of the prestige dance school in Taiwan, has won many awards in Southern California.”

“We also have an historical society headed by Dr. George Yu who is on the medical staff of St. John’s [Regional Medical Center]. A DVD, the *Courage and Contribution of the Chinese in Ventura County* was given

to all the high schools as well as all the libraries in Ventura County.”

“With the cooperation of Ventura City Council and our historical society, a mural has been painted of China Alley across from the Mission in downtown Ventura. The historical society is now working on a book on the Chinese in Ventura County.”

“Our club is open to anyone who is interested in promoting understanding, tolerance, and harmony in our society. Today I am honored to recognize one of your graduate parents who demonstrated through hard work and effort to guide our youths to a better society. Mr. Eric Plambeck who was our Club President in 1997, 2000 and 2001, promoted our club’s ideal. His efforts has guide[d] our youths. He bridged and enlightened the understanding of our dual culture and betters our society. Today I am delighted to present to Eric Plambeck’s daughter Liesel Plambeck the William D. Soo Hoo Scholarship.”

“Liesel Plambeck has won our highest scholarship and we wish her well in all her endeavors.”
