Greetings from the President

The Easter Egg Hunt was enjoyed by all, especially the children, at the Ling Ranch in Somis on Sat., Apr. 23rd. There were games, a light lunch, and eggs-galore! Thanks goes to Lesley Ling Sule, chairperson, Suzie and Leslie Jue, Youth Group, and parents.

Our next event is the combined Memorial Day Picnic and Awards & Installation event on Mon., May 30th. Memorial Day is a federal holiday observed each year to commemorate American servicemen and women who died in battle.

Since the late 50's on the Thursday before Memorial Day, the 1,200 soldiers of the Army's 3d U.S. Infantry place small American flags at each of the more than 260,000 gravestones at Arlington National Cemetery. They then patrol 24 hours a day during the weekend to ensure that each flag remains standing. In 1951, the Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts of St. Louis (Missouri) began placing flags on the 150,000 graves at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery as an annual Good Turn. More recently, beginning in 1998, on the Saturday before the observed day for Memorial Day, the Boys Scouts and Girl Scouts place a candle at each of approximately 15,300 grave sites of soldiers buried at Fredericksburg and Spotsylvania National Military Park on Marye's Heights (Virginia). And in 2004, Washington D.C. held its first Memorial Day parade in over 60 years.

Memorial Day often marks the start of the summer vacation season, and Labor Day its end.

Most important bring your ballot to vote for next year's Officers and Board of Directors. Awards & Installation of incoming officers and board of directors will be held.

Proposed Change to the VCCAA By-Laws

The Board of Directors is considering a change to a by-law concerning the consecutive terms served by the President and Vice-President.

Proposed change to the by-laws is as follows:

SECTION 3: OFFICERS

The officers shall consist of a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. These

Officers shall be elected annually by the members to serve from 1 July to 30 June of the following year. ~~The President and Vice-President shall not hold the same office more than two consecutive terms.~~





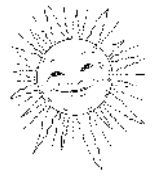
